## WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH THE CLUB UNDER NEW MANAGEMENT THEN?

Negotiations with the London Club have resulted in their granting an Affiliated Membership to Warwick Club members after the transfer to the NewCo. The Affiliated Membership will give Warwick/NewCo members the right to use Club facilities in BBC London premises and entitle members to join the subsections, such as the Inland Waterways, Yachting and Canoeing. The proposed fee for Affiliated Membership will be from £42.50, £67.50 or £92.50 based on salary, plus the subscription for each section joined. Steve Carr has a stock of application forms.

Members who retire and are on a BBC pension will be entitled to apply to the London Club as Retired Members.

A representative from Pebble Mill has said that reciprocal membership privileges will be available after Warwick Club transfers to the NewCo.

Once the NewCo logo has been agreed, new membership cards will be issued.
